FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

As the **Church Council** gets underway for another year of ministry at Bethel, a few changes will be implemented. Though the Council will continue its management function it will begin to move toward a more active planning role as well.

In an effort to allow churches more flexibility in how they chose to structure themselves, The Book of Discipline was revised several years ago. The old Council on Ministries (planning group)/Administrative Board (administrative group) structure was replaced in most churches by a **Church Council**. Unfortunately, what got lost in the process in many congregations was the process of planning and coordination. We spent more time talking about what we had done (reporting) than we did talking about and acting on what we wanted to do.

Ellen Davis, new **Church Council** chairperson, will build on our strong Council administrative structure by leading us in enhancing our planning and coordinating functions. Management is important in any **Church Council** and Bethel can be quite proud of its Council's diligence in this area, particularly in light of our recent restoration emergency. Leadership is also important for a Council. It is true, "if you don't know where you are going any road will get you there." The **Church Council** is responsible for helping us to chart a course for the future.

Each month the Council will focus on a particular area(s) of ministry. It is our hope to publish to the congregation the agenda each month so that you can be present for discussion if you would like. After looking at a particular area, the Council will develop action steps to implement future plans. These action steps may require work from several groups within the congregation. The Council will be the place where this coordinating effort will begin, if necessary.

Whenever we change the way we do anything, there is always stress....even if the change is good change. Having children was one of the very good things to happen in my life. It was also quite stressful, particularly at first when I wasn't quite certain about what to do. I suspect our learning curve as the Council continues to grow will be a little stressful. I am convinced that this is the next logical step in implementing the wonderful ministry to which we have been called. Please keep the Council and your church leaders in your prayers. God is certainly in our midst and where God leads, we will discover....in God's time. See you Sunday!

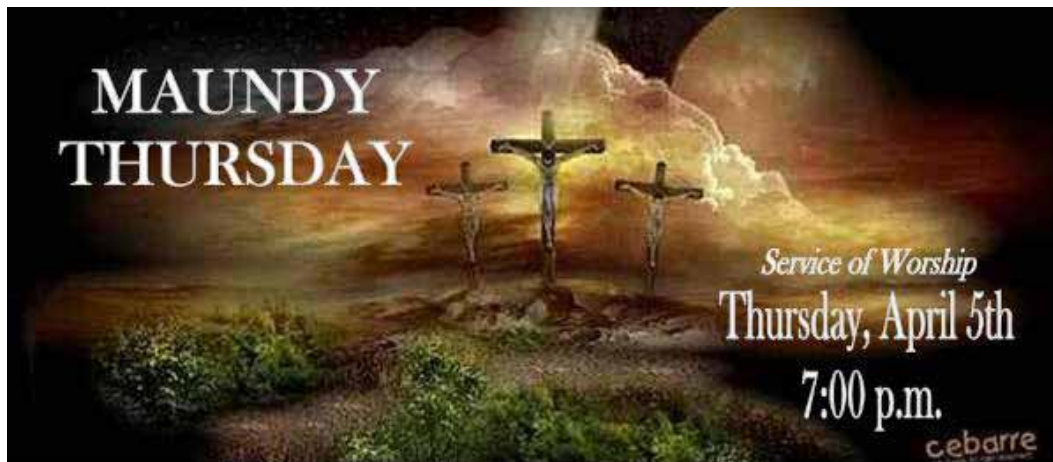

The Apex of Lent

Lent The color is purple, and the mood is serious. The word ‘lent’ comes from ancient language roots, signifying the lengthening of days. Our days grow longer, and the growing season is upon us. Let’s compare Advent to Lent. Advent is the season when days are becoming shorter. In the cold short days of winter, we draw inward and wait for God’s promises to be fulfilled. Lent calls us in the opposite direction. We must not wait on anything—it is the season we must plant and harvest, and be the best steward of our talents we can possibly be. During Lent, rather than waiting on God, we pursue God. We seek to know God’s plan for our lives in a deeper and more honest way. We weed our spiritual garden. We go on a diet—to make more holy this earthly temple in which our spirits are bound. Lent involves admission. It is the season we admit to things we’ve done wrong, and things we’ve left undone. Lent is the season during which we turn around and shout “Get thee behind me, Satan—and anything else that might stand between me and God!

During Lent, we witness the culmination of Christ’s ministry on earth. We walk his last days, and relive his last known miracles.

Worship during Lent seeks to reflect all these things. And, Lent 2012 contains some very straightforward things... Read on in the following boxes of this page.

Two Lenten Themes for 11:15 Worship

KYRIE ELEISON

Lord, Have Mercy Upon Us

While we repent and seek to make things right with God during Lent, we constantly cry for mercy.

Lord, have mercy. Christ, have mercy. Lord, have mercy... This prayer will get a Christian through some tight and hard times.

Chancel Choir will sing some form of the mercy cry in every service of Lent 2012. These will range from the simplest unison responses to an elaborate setting written for Notre Dame Cathedral, Paris; a mercy cry which afford a glimpse of the gargoyles which adorn the exterior walls of this great house of worship. In between the simple and the grand, we hear two Kyrie Eleison settings from Austria—one by F. J. Haydn, another from Franz Schubert. We’ll probably hear one from Czech lands too. And, still another will sound as if it were created a modern mega-church near Atlanta’s perimeter I-85 highway.

We all need mercy... God’s mercy... Humankind’s mercy. Who are the people? What are the causes? What are the areas in each of our own lives which cry for each and everyone to show mercy? Some cries for mercy are sweet and evocative. Other cries for mercy are tortured, agonizing groans. Which do you have going on in your life? Which will you answer? Which will set you free?

God, Be In My Head

There is an ancient prayer is taken from *The Book of Hours, Sarum, 1514* (South of England, near Salisbury). This is a prayer for God to completely overtake us. Three different choral settings of this beautiful prayer will occur during Lent 2012.

As the Lenten season is a time for reflection, self evaluation, and traditionally a time of self denial, you are invited to gather some silver coins daily (perhaps, instead of spending them on that extra cup of coffee or on your favorite candy bar) and to bring your collected coins with you when you come for worship on Palm/Passion Sunday, at which time, they will be dedicated for HUNGRIEF, a United Methodist program to fight world hunger. You should know that 80% of the gifts of silver coins to HUNGRIEF go to support World Hunger Special Programs and 20% are retained for use in hunger-related ministries throughout South Carolina.

Please join us in the universal fight against starvation as we continue to serve Christ by serving our brothers and sisters in need through your participation in this special project throughout these often difficult days of reflection; days when we take the time to ask some tough questions about our faith and what it does mean to reach out to others, as Christ reached out to us. Jesus said, "I was hungry and you gave me something to eat." The **THIRTY PIECES OF SILVER** project is certainly one way we can follow his desire for us to help feed those with no means to feed themselves.

- Approximately 150,000 Americans will be diagnosed with colon cancer each year.
- Colon cancer often has no symptoms at all until it's at an advanced stage.
- Colon cancer is 80% preventable when detected early.
- You can reduce your risk through regular screenings.
- Beginning at age 50 (or earlier if you have a family history, I was 48), everyone should get their colon checked.

Despite its high incidence, colorectal cancer is one of the most detectable and, if found early enough, most treatable forms of cancer.

Minutes of January 17th Meeting

Ellen Davis, Chairman opened the meeting with 22 present. Rev. John Warren prayed and offered a special prayer for Music Director, Greg Jones, who suffered a fall this week. Mrs. Davis asked the council to take provided literature home, and after reading through it, make suggestions to her concerning the role of the Church Council at Bethel. She will summarize our suggestions and comments, then report the findings at the February meeting.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES FROM DECEMBER 2011

MOTION: A motion was made to approve the December 2011 minutes by Fitz Hardin, and seconded by Stanley Rodgers, and passed unanimously.

OFFICER REPORTS

Lay Leader: Stanley Rodgers reported that he will meet with the pastor concerning the role of the Lay Leader at Bethel then make a report next month.

***Membership Secretary:** Fitz Hardin reported that Bethel's total CHURCH MEMBERS are 1,133. 703 CHURCH MEMBERS are active. (Active members are defined as those who have contributed or attended in the past year.)

***Treasurer:** Sharon Hinnant shared historical budget information from 2011. 100% apportionments were paid, and we received more revenue than was budgeted. The term "Restricted Accounts" was explained, and the balance sheets were reviewed. Mrs. Hinnant invited questions. Rev. Warren was most pleased, and added that in all of the churches he has served, he has never seen a more positive "year-end spread sheet."

ADMINISTRATIVE COMMITTEES

Finance: Brad Rustin presented a prepared Budget for 2012 from the Finance Committee.

It is most unusual that our church ended up with a surplus at the end the year.

At the direction of the Church Council last year, the staff employee salaries are now grouped into one account to avoid problems.

\$792,000 is estimated in 2012 revenues.

MOTION: Recommendation to approve the 2012 Budget as proposed as it was previously sent out to Council Members. During discussion it was added that \$5,000 has been included for "contingency." The motion carried: Unanimous yea.

MOTION: The Finance Committee's motion to utilize the existing funds in the [Fund Principal and Excess Cash Received Account](#) was made, seconded and passed unanimously for recommendation to the Church Council:

\$135,479.92	Account balance as of December 31, 2011
- 65,000.00	Provide to the Trustees for window repairs/replacement in the Educational Building
- 8,000.00	Remainder of money due on pews and/or Chapel renovations
<u>- 37,479.92</u>	Pay to principal balance on Sanctuary Restoration Loan
<u>\$ 25,000.00</u>	Remaining Balance in Fund Principal Account #2801

TRUSTEES REPORT

During February maintenance on the roof of the Education Building will be done as preparation for repair and painting of forty-seven windows. The roof maintenance, using the appropriate materials, includes the sealing of drip edges/ gravel stops, pitch pockets, wall caps, base of parapet walls, base of exhaust vents, and any other roof penetrations.

A Knox box is installed at the North entrance of the Education Building. The Knox box securely contains keys that are accessible to the Charleston Fire Department.

Wooden chairs are available for any Bethel class or group that needs them to supplement their seating capacity.
